

A Course for Israeli Tour Guides for Guiding Protestant Christians in Israel

Protestant Christians come to Israel to understand the land of Israel-- its geography, history, and archaeology--- in order to better understand the Bible. Many of the Protestant Christians know the bible stories, what they are hoping is to understand the Bible, this is what brings them to Israel, and part of a tour guide's job is to help them achieving it. Too often, Protestant Christians leave Israel with a sense of disappointment because while they saw a lot and learned a lot about modern Israel, and heard the familiar bible stories, they didn't really gain new insight into their Bible, because they cannot get what they have seen to the physical, historical, cultural, and spiritual contexts of the Bible. This online course aims at helping Israel tour guides to provide Protestant Christians a best-in-class experience to relate their guiding to someone that comes here in order to understand the Bible.

This online course comes from my years of lecturing Israeli tour guides about guiding Christians in Israel, and the repeated request for an opportunity for guides to learn more and have a more comprehensive learning experience from me that provides practical and actionable ideas for tour guides with their Christian clients. **This course offers Israeli tour guides unique insights that will help them more effectively guide Protestant Christians in Israel**. I bring twenty-two years of guiding experience working with Protestant Christians through the lands of the Bible (Israel, Jordan, Egypt, Turkey, Greece, and Italy). My desire is to help Israeli tour guides better understand their Protestant clients, what they want and need from their tours to Israel, in order to help the guides more effectively guide Protestant Christians.
